Council Proceedings
Thursday, July 21, 2011

A special meeting of the Cody City Council was held in Council Chambers of City Hall in Cody, Wyoming on Thursday, July 21, 2011 at 4:15 p.m.

Present: Mayor Nancy Tia Brown, Council Members Steve Miller, Bryan Edwards, Donny Anderson, Charles Cloud, Jerry Fritz, and Stan Wolz, City Administrator, Jenni Rosencranse, City Attorney, Scott Kolpitcke, and Administrative Services Officer, Cindy Baker.

Absent: None

Mayor Brown called the meeting to order at 4:19 p.m.

The Governing Body discussed the Small Community Air Service Development Grant that the Yellowstone Regional Airport Joint Powers Board is the sponsoring entity. Council Member Wolz made a motion seconded by Council Member Edwards authorizing the Mayor to sign a letter of support on behalf of the Cody City Council.

Council Member Wolz made a motion seconded by Council Member Cloud to approve and authorize the Mayor to sign the grant agreement between the City of Cody and the Wyoming Department of State Parks and Cultural Resources for Building the Wyoming Veterans' Memorial Park – Freedom Monument. Vote was unanimous.

The Governing Body discussed several City owned properties and directed staff to proceed with obtaining appraisals on said property and proceed with the Request for Bid process.

Council Member Wolz made a motion seconded by Council Member Miller authorizing the Mayor to sign an Affidavit of Possession and Claim under tax Deed for Block 12, Lot 7, Valley View Subdivision, Park County, WY. Vote was unanimous.

Council Member Miller made a motion seconded by Council Member Cloud authorizing payment of taxes in the amount of \$12,545.15 to Park County for Block 12, Lot 7, Valley View Subdivision, Park County, WY. Vote was unanimous.

Council Member Wolz informed the Governing Body of the work the LDS Youth group did on the hillside going up Heart Mountain Street and indicated the Church will be looking for a community project in the near future. Council Member Cloud gave an update on the Transportation Authority Board. Council Member Miller remarked on the Shoshone Municipal Pipeline project. Mayor Brown commented on the Bureau of Land Management and Forest Service are in the process of developing and/or reviewing a 20 year plan and should the Council consider writing a statement. She also indicated Lenard Moore had presented her with his plans and desire for the retail liquor license the City has available. He was informed of the committee working on the criteria for the retail liquor license.

There being no further business to discuss, the Mayor Brown adjourned the meeting at 5:39 p.m.
